## *Unveiling Creativity: The Grand Inauguration of BlissBeat 2024*

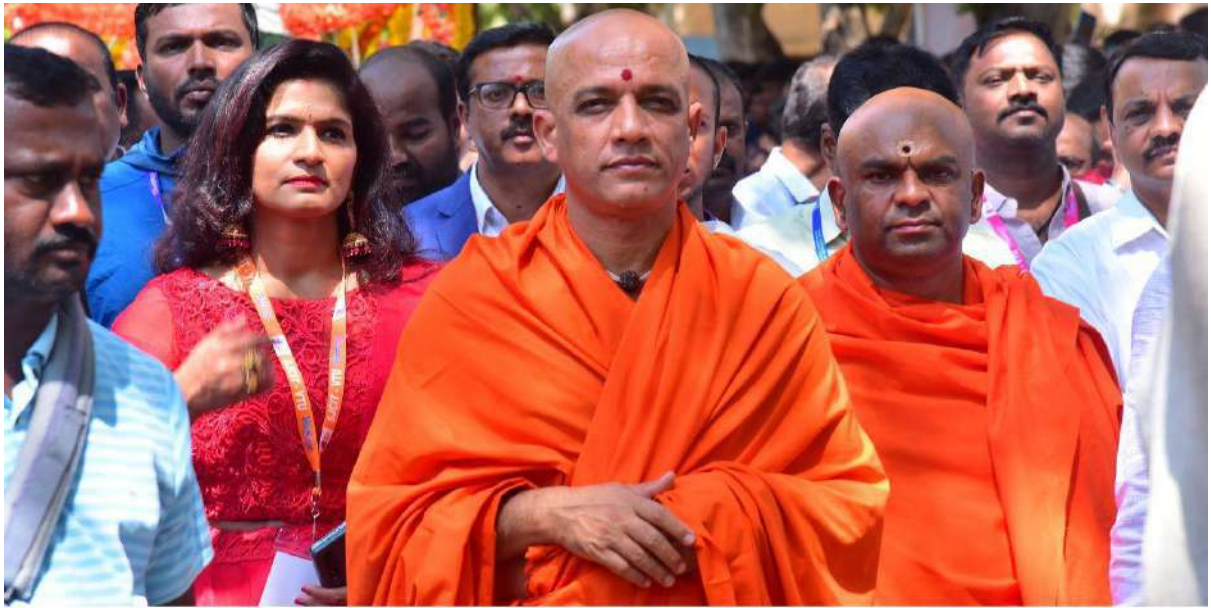

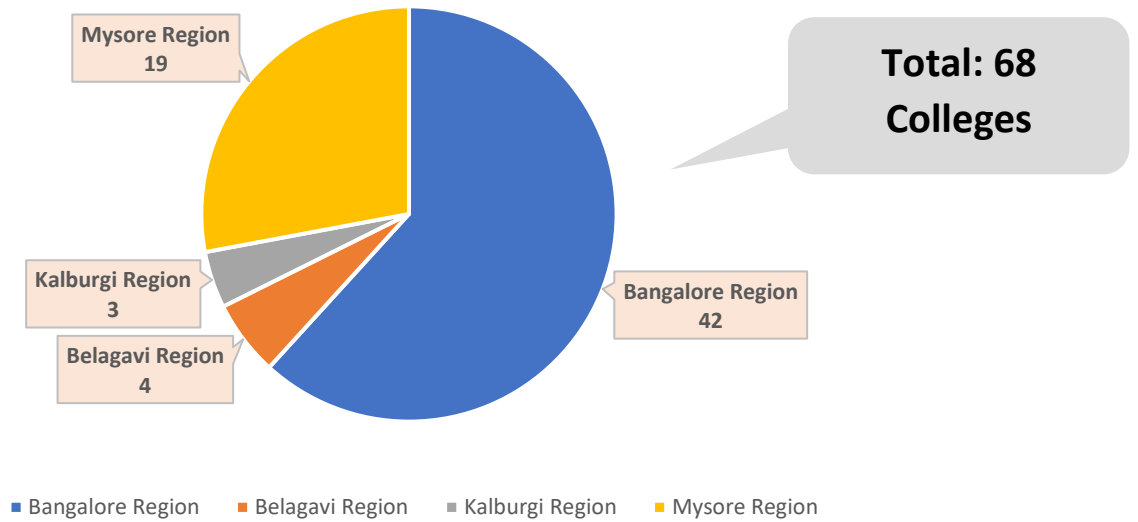

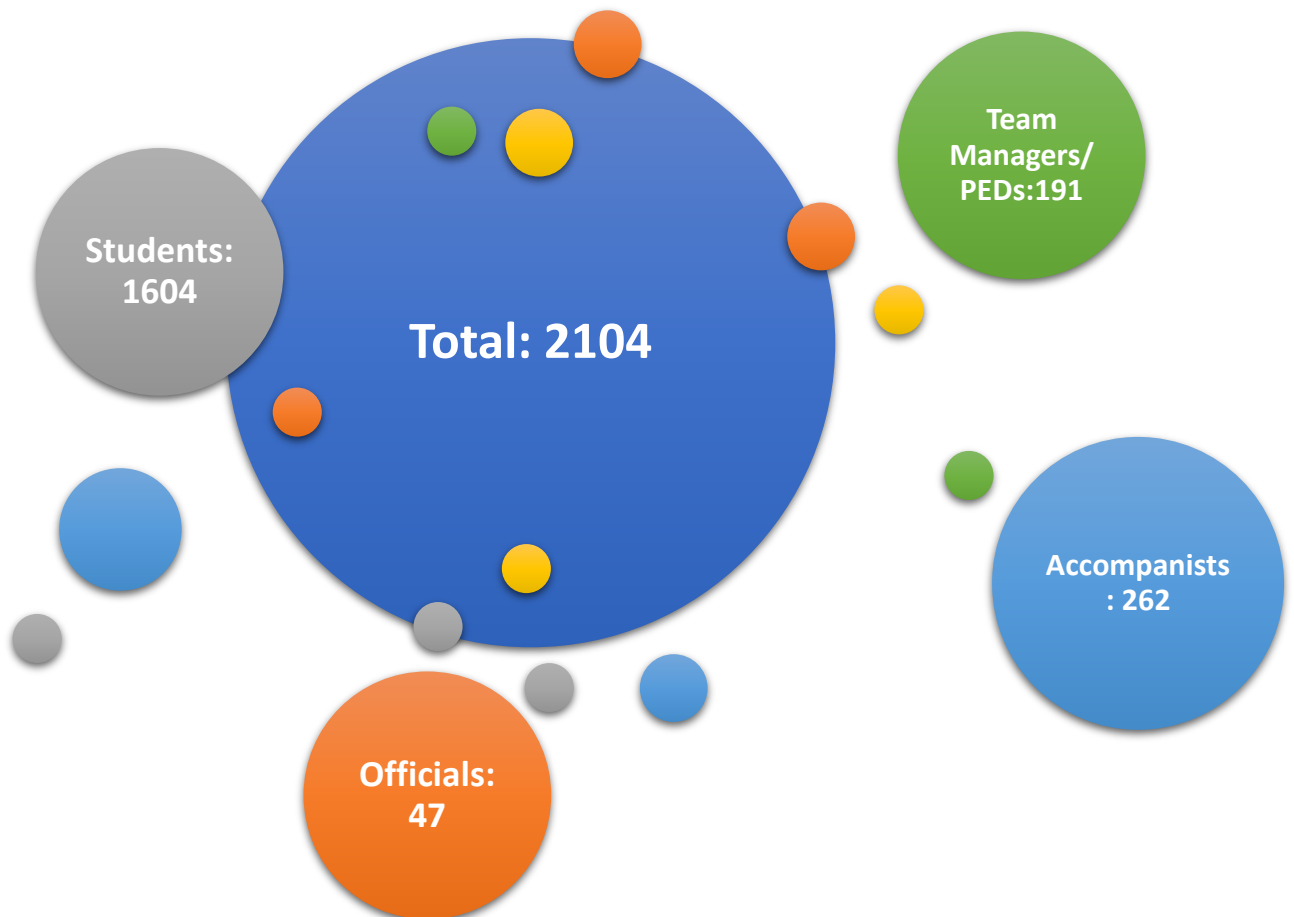

Classical Instrumental Solo (Persussion Tala Vadya) typically involves a musician showcasing their expertise in playing a classical instrument with the accompaniment of percussion instruments. This genre offers a platform for instrumentalists to display their mastery of melody, rhythm, and improvisation within the framework of classical ragas or compositions. In such a solo performance, the musician may choose from a variety of classical instruments such as sitar, sarod, flute, violin, santoor, sarangi, etc. Each instrument brings its unique tonal quality and techniques to the performance, allowing for a rich and diverse musical experience.



- Participation: Only 1 participant per institute.
- Duration: 15 minutes (including set-up and clearance time).
- A maximum of 2 accompaniments are allowed, excluding a Shruthi Box.
- Participants shall bring their own instruments. Keyboards are not allowed.
- The item can be presented in either Hindustani or Carnatic style.
- Instruments of western origin adapted to the Indian Raga system are allowed.
- Reporting time will be provided along with the schedule of the event.
- Decisions of the organizers and panel of judge(s) will be final and binding.

## Debate



*Debate: where ideas clash and minds ignite!*

A debate is a discussion or structured contest about an issue or a resolution. A formal debate involves two sides: one supports a resolution and one opposing it. Such a debate is bound by rules previously agreed upon. Debates may be judged in order to declare a winning side. A debate is an organized argument or contest of ideas in which the participants discuss a topic from two opposing sides. Those who agree with this statement or idea are the "Pro" side. Those who will not agree with this statement or idea are the "Con" side. Each side will show in an organized and clever way why they believe to have the right answers. They will use examples and evidence to support their ideas while working towards a conclusion.

The aim of a debate is to convince the opposition that you are right. When the two sides agree on the subject or when one side's arguments are more convincing than the other side that is when the debate comes to a close. In a formal debate, a mediator (a person that has not agreed with the Pro or the Con) will decide who the winner should be. In an informal debate the argument can continue until the time when one side gives up.

**Debate Topics:** Education, Technology, Science, Politics, Environment, Society



- Each team will consist of two members.
- One will speak "for the motion" and the other member will speak "against the motion".
- Each team will get 10 minutes (4 +4 minutes) to speak and 2 minutes for interjection.
- The team supporting the motion must not shift its point of view.
- If a speaker makes a statement, they must be able to provide evidence or reasons to support the statement.
- Facts presented in a debate must be accurate.
- Speakers may not bring up new points in a rebuttal speech.
- **British Parliamentary debate format** for Final round
- Debate consists of four teams, containing two speakers each, which are divided into two sides that speak for and against the motion. Due to the style's origins in British parliamentary procedure, the two sides are called the Government and the Opposition.
- **The five steps in Debate:**
- Introduction: Express your message and why it's important to your audience, as well as yourself.
- Statement of fact: Break down the general thesis of your argument into smaller parts.
- Confirmation, or proof.
- Refutation.
- Conclusion.

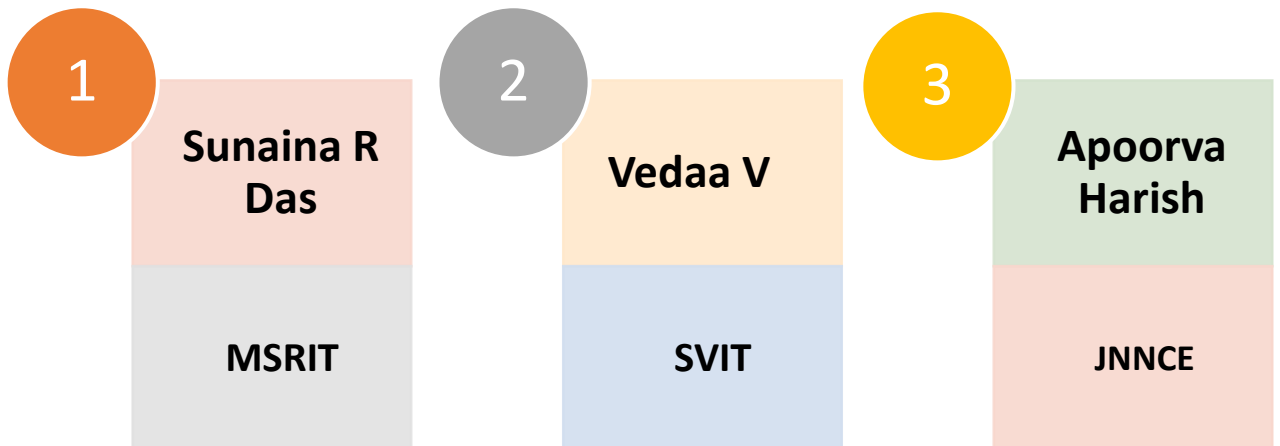

Spot photography can be contrasted with more staged or planned forms of photography, where subjects are carefully posed and environments are manipulated for the desired effect. Instead, spot photography embraces the unpredictability and dynamism of real-life situations, seeking to document moments of significance or interest as they occur in the world around us.



- Participation: only one participant per institute.
- Duration: 4 hours.
- The participant shall get their own digital camera and memory card. The memory card shall be formatted by the judges before the commencement of the contest.
- Mobile phones, drones and other forms of image capturing technologies are not allowed.
- The participant has to capture 5 photographs on the theme announced on the spot by the judges.
- No mixing, matching or morphing of photographs will be permitted.
- Image manipulation software such as Photoshop, Gimp, etc. for enhancing images are not permitted.
- The subject of the photo should be within defined geographic limits.
- The organizers shall have the rights for the use of these pictures at their discretion.
- Any additional instructions will be announced on the spot.
- Reporting time will be provided along with the schedule of the event.
- Decisions of the organizers and panel of judge(s) will be final and binding.

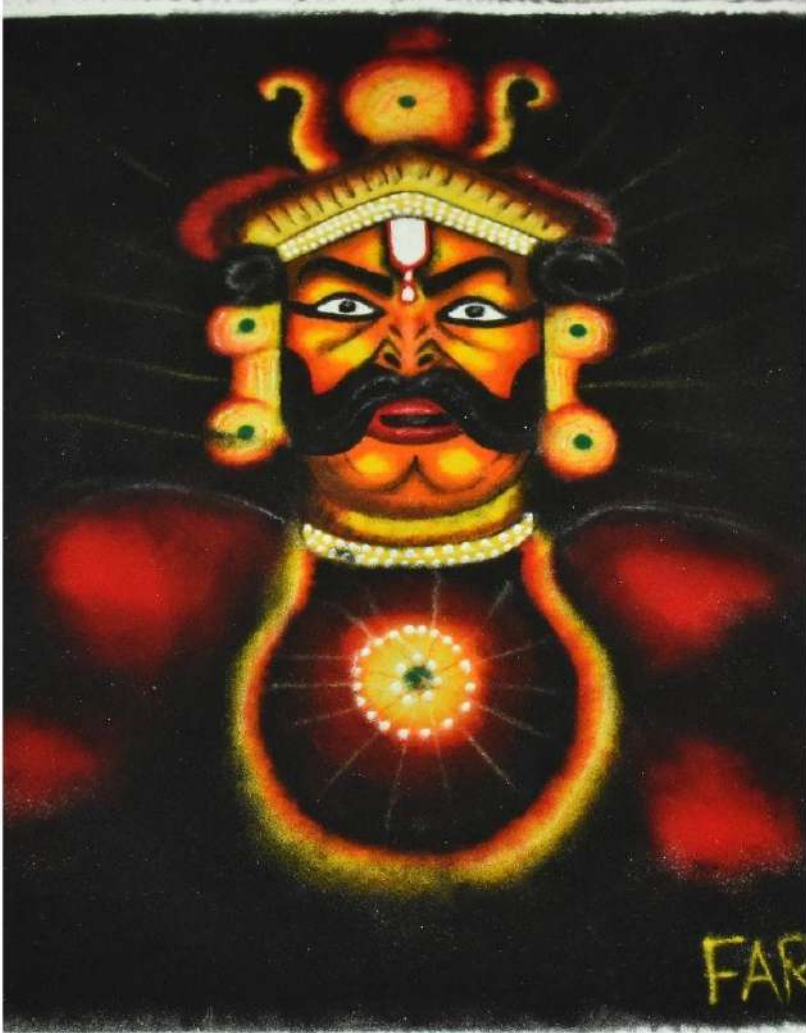
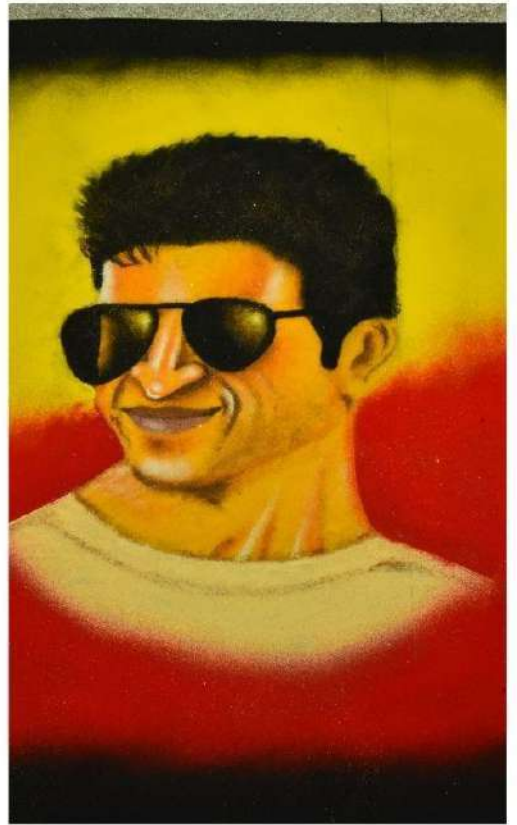
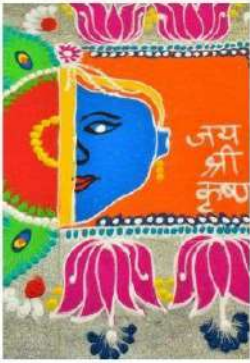
